However, Hamish and Jess will be at the Hawke's Bay Tourism office at 19 Waghorne Street, Ahuriri daily at 9am for anybody wishing to drop in.

Cruise ship activity at Napier Port has been paused until such time as the city and region can appropriately support their arrival.

The reopening of SH51 between Napier and Clive for essential traffic is heartening, and we await further news about key gateway roads so that visitors currently in Hawke's Bay can depart.
