As new information relevant to the visitor economy becomes available, we will continue to share with our members and important industry stakeholders.

Napier Port, in agreement with Napier City Council, have made the decision that cruise ship calls will not call Napier for the next week, ending Sunday 26th February 2023. This time will enable the region to work on recovery and clean up, while we await the reinstatement of the electrical supply to the region. Napier Port will continue to review on an ongoing basis with other stakeholders and update by Thursday next week.

The attached communication from Napier's Emergency Operations Centre was sent this morning, providing a detailed update as at 5.30am.
